We have more parents than ever involved in the running of the Club and we have more boys and girls coming through the gates to take part and enjoy our games. The ideal of being actively involved in the administration of our Club is not just a notion, it is

something I intend to build on. My wish is that everyone coming through the gates feel that they belong to the Club and are willing to give a little of their time in order to advance the Club's objectives. Today I am asking you to get more involved in the running of this wonderful Club and to be as generous as you can be with your time in volunteering your service to the Club. We are constantly seeking people who are willing to volunteer and lighten the load on those already involved.

To reflect on the year past, I wish to say a big thank you to all the coaches and the team managers for their expertise, and for the manner in which our teams have been coached and prepared for all our matches. As I write this piece, our **Junior Team** have finished their League campaign where they finished **fourth in Division 1D**. Success in the Championship eluded us once again. The Team is going in the right direction and I am confident that success will come for these lads. Our **Under 21 Team** are still in the Championship and I sincerely hope that they will be in the shake up on Final day. Our **Minor Team** exceeded all expectations, winning the **West Mayo B Championship** and following it up with winning the **Division 4 County Championship**. This was a remarkable achievement for this group and I have no doubt that these lads will be the backbone of our **Junior Team** for many years to come. All the Underage Teams have been hugely successful, competing in various Semi-finals, and competing and winning at the various Blitzes. Well done to everyone involved. Our Girls' Teams continue to improve year on year, steady progress is being made and success is not far away. The Club is delighted that the girls of the area have an outlet to partake of Gaelic games and culture.

This year, for the first in a while, the Club are entering **Scór na nÓg**. I wish the participants all the best and I hope they enjoy the experience. I am sure they will do the Club proud. This is an important aspect of Club life and is something I am anxious to build on for the future. It is important that the boys and girls are allowed showcase their abundance of talent and this is a wonderful stage to do this.

As you know, the Club has commenced a **development programme** which will see the development of an additional playing pitch, the development of an all-weather training area, the construction of a kicking wall and a storage shed. We have been successful in obtaining funding from the **Sports Capital Fund**. **€80,000** has been allocated to the Club and I want to express the Club's gratitude to **Minister Ring** for this allocation. I also wish to express the Club's gratitude to **Allergan Pharmaceuticals** for their allocation of **\$10,000** towards the cost of this development. We were also successful in obtaining **€11,000 from Connacht Council** towards this development. The projected total cost is **€140,000** and this ultimately means that some fundraising will be required. With your support the amount needed is very achievable. This is an exciting time for the Club. This development will ensure that our facilities will be the best and will provide a good playing experience for the boys and the girls coming through the gates.

Finally I want to thank each one of you for your courtesy and for your co-operation over the past three years. It has been a privilege to have been the Chairman.

I wish to extend season's greetings to you all, and to our emigrants overseas, I wish to assure you that you are foremost in our thoughts and we look forward to the day when you return home.

This year a major expansion of Club facilities are planned, as outlined by the Chairman in his introduction, including the development of an extra playing pitch. It is of interest to reflect back to **1936** when the Club first secured its own grounds, 'St. Brendan's Park', when it purchased lands at Rossakeeran from the Land Commission. Prior to this they were dependent on the good will of landholders to play their games. The Sports Park contained 5 acres, 3 roods, 24 perches and was purchased for the sum of 81 pounds. Kilmeena were one of the first clubs to have their own playing pitch and it was a source of great pride to them.

Greetings from the Kilmeena Diaspora:

...Kieran Sheridan in Muscat

It's the 28th of November 2015 and I hobble down to breakfast in a small Irish bar in Bahrain before taking a flight back to Muscat in the Sultanate of Oman. Stephen and I chat about where it all went wrong the evening before, most likely the Guinness! After a full day of football, our club Clann na hOman made it to the Intermediate Final at the Bahrain Irish Festival. A point down with a minute to go in the final, Kilmeena club members will find it hard to believe that Stephen Sheridan popped up in the forwards to level the game and take it to extra time! Alas, we ran out of steam as Sharjah Gaels from the UAE emerged victorious. It's been a while since I've played in a football final and the memories of playing in the Black and White of Kilmeena in a similar style tournament at St. Judes in Dublin came flooding back.

Going back a few years to August 2008, I underwent a knee operation and decided to take a year out of football to gain some overseas work experience. It was always my intention to return to Kilmeena after a year of rehabilitation, but, unfortunately, the healing process did not go as planned. After seven and a half years, I still find it hard to believe I am still here in the Middle East! Becoming involved in a GAA club certainly helped. There have been

the call to prayer. Whilst we don't have to deal with the hard slog through a boggy St. Brendan's pitch in the winter months (and that's no disrespect to Joe Madden and Danny Fadden, who tended admirably to the field in my days!), we must deal with temperatures reaching the high 40's. We have on average 15 players per session. The majority of members are Irish with a mix of enthusiastic Aussies, English and Americans who bring the same banter to that of a dressing room at home in Mayo.

There are five tournaments per year in various Gulf countries. Each tournament is an amazing spectacle to witness with camogie, hurling, kid's football, and men's and women's football on display. The

Happy Christmas and a Prosperous New Year to all in Kilmeena, from the Madden family in Stittsville, Canada. We have been here five years and are very grateful. This year is the first year that we do not have snow yet! Snow is a great thing to put on the Santa letter over here! We usually get 6 months of it! Nigel is working for the same company that we started with, Thomas Cavanagh Construction, as a Sewer Crew Supervisor. Thomas Cavanagh Constuction was established in 1971, by 2 brothers, descendents of an Irish Immigrant that came to Canada in the 1800's, from Cavan. Stittsville is a small village, ever expanding, just 20 minutes from Ottawa, the Capital of Canada. Ottawa has a vibrant Irish Community, and a Gaelic Football Club called the Ottawa Gaels, that both Nigel, the girls and I have played for. Nigel continues to work with the youth, that is ever increasing in numbers thanks to the dedication of Noel Mc Ginnity of Monaghan and a number of other Irish Immigrants. The Gaels have started creating pockets of Gaelic football groups in any part of the city that

we have support to do so, and this gives the kids

the opportunity to play games against each other and try out their new skills! The Ottawa Gaels Youth aim every year is to send a team to the Continental Youth Championships somewhere in America. We have attended in Boston and Chicago so far and next year it will be hosted in Boston.

We are coming into the season of "Irish Breakfasts" at the Irish Centre in the City. This is something we have always enjoyed since we moved and keeps us connected, especially the girls, to some Irish Tradition. Volunteers prepare pancakes and sausages, with an Irish music session in the back ground for whoever shows up. This is usually a full house

spend most of Christmas and New Year on Skype, and it feels a little like we're there.

We hope all our neighbours and friends are doing well and Ireland as a country is doing well and can someday welcome all of its emigrants home. But for now this is our home and it has allowed us freedom and experiences that our girls I am sure will remember as fond childhood memories, such as going camping, swimming in the pool all summer, going to the cottage to see Moose and endless summer bbq's.


